Because of my ties to the "land", I have a profound interest in its history. In 1997 I have read two good books on the subjects of homesteading and the Iowa prairie.

Bad Land by Jonathan Raban is a well-researched historical account of homesteading. It details the promotion and selling of land by the government and the railroads. Bad Land is a winner of the National Book Critics Circle Award for nonfiction.

Take This Exit is a collection of short stories subtitled "Rediscovering the Iowa Landscape" and is edited by Robert F. Sayre. In recommending this book I would just quote author W.P. Kinsella, "If you love Iowa as much as I do, you'll love this book."

Both books are available in paperback at most bookstores or check at your local library. After reading the books I've made a New Years resolution I think I can keep. In 1998 I am going to walk one of the Iowa prairies during each of the four seasons. You may want to do the same! Here is a short list of some of the larger prairies around the state.
